WKCE Testing

The Wisconsin Knowledge & Concepts Examination (WKCE) is scheduled for:

November 5, 6, and 7

November 12, 13, and 14

Grades 6, 7, 8, and 10 will be taking the WKCE test. Students will take the test during 2nd period and 3rd period.

Grades 9, 11, and 12 will attend their regularly scheduled classes on these days.

These standardized tests include commercially-developed questions used in schools across the country and questions developed specifically for WI in order to improve coverage of WI academic standards. The WKCE measures achievement in reading, language applications, mathematics, science and social studies using a multiple choice and short answer questions.

If you report by phone, you are also required to send us a written explanation within two days of the child returning to school following the absence.
